GOOGLE WALLET vs. PayPal

I have faith that Google will 'do it better' and be an efficient alternative to PayPal for online transactions. A recent Wall Street Journal news article based on an unnamed source said Google will be ready this year to introduce an electronic-payment service, code-named **Google Wallet**, that some stock market analyst(s) said could adversely affect PayPal. I HOPE IT DOES.

PayPal is seriously flawed, as mentioned in a feature article I wrote in August of 2003. Having personally listed more than ten articles for auction and successfully sold ten+ times on eBay, I ~~am~~ was a 'Gold Star' eBay seller, meaning everyone that bought anything I listed were happy with the quality of goods, condition, shipping, etc. All feedback for me, the seller, was very good.

The last item I listed for auction sold for \$11.00 and the seller deposited the money into my PayPal account. My eBay fees for the various seller expenses totaled \$3.70. I opted to pay the eBay fees from the \$11.00 the seller paid, which was sitting in my PayPal account. To my surprise, I started receiving 'notices' from eBay that they could not process my credit card for the \$3.70. I emailed them back, saying that credit card had expired and they were NOT to attempt to obtain the \$3.70 via credit card, anyway. I again reiterated that they were to take the \$3.70 from my PayPal account.

After several unsuccessful attempts to charge my expired credit card they froze my PayPal and eBay account(s). They now have my \$11.00, *rather than the \$3.70* and needless to say, I will NEVER use eBay again...
