## Apple Gives Digital MUSIC Lovers what they REALLY want!

Until this month, songs purchased from iTunes digital music store were recognized by, and had to be played on, Apple products only. Now, for \$1.29 each, tracks on **iTunes Plus** CAN be played on competing MP3 players! Why?? because *Digital Rights Management copy protection has been removed* from the iTunes Plus/EMI catalog. iTunes customers that previously downloaded these songs for .99 can upgrade to the **enhanced CD-audio quality** DRM-free version for only \$ .30 ;-).

Thousands of songs are currently available due to the agreement between Apple and the world's 3rd largest music company - London-based EMI. I see this as a step in the right direction. Recent industry research estimates that consumers will spend \$9 billion on mobile music in 2007, including ringtones and music downloads.

The music & software industries were behind passage of the Digital Rights Management [**DRM**] movement of several years ago, making it illegal to distribute, play or copy songs or movies. Many DRM issues and cases have surfaced over a consumers ability to exercise their legal rights of fair use and de minimis use. Consumer access to information has been and continues to be, directly threatened by early digital rights management initiatives.

Many believe that Digital Rights Management software was *designed to impose restrictions* on computer users and that the use of the word "rights" in this way was designed to protect the viewpoint of the few that imposed the restrictions, while ignoring that of the many on whom the restrictions were and are, imposed.

AACS, the "Advanced Access Content System" promoted by Disney, IBM, Microsoft, Intel, Sony, and others, aims to restrict use of HDTV recordings—and software—so they can't be used except as *these companies permit*. ## Study: iPods Can Make Pacemakers Malfunction

\*\*\*WARNING\*\*\*

In May, an interesting study presented by a 17-year-old high school student at a meeting of heart specialists found that **iPods** can cause cardiac implantable **pacemakers** to **mal-function** by interfering with the electromagnetic equipment monitoring the heart!

The study tested the effect of the portable music devices on 100 patients, *whose mean age was 77*, outfitted with pacemakers. Electrical **interference was detected half of the time when the iPod was held just 2 inches from the patient's chest for 5 to 10 seconds.**

In some cases, the iPods caused interference when held 18 inches from the chest. Interfering with the telemetry equipment caused the device to misread the heart's pacing and **in one case caused the pacemaker to stop functioning altogether. Full story [HERE](#).**
